❖ **What Is It?** The Sea Ice for Walrus Outlook (SIWO) provides online weekly reports with information on weather and sea ice conditions in Alaska walrus hunting regions.

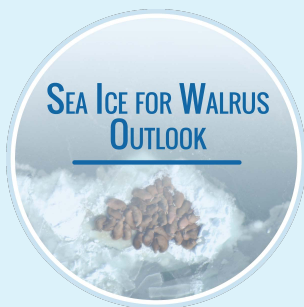
❖ **Why Does It Matter?** The Sea Ice for Walrus Outlook is a unique project that integrates scientific information and local observations in accessible formats for use by Alaska Native subsistence hunters, coastal communities, and others interested in sea ice and walrus.

❖ **Who Makes It Happen?** The Walrus Outlook is supported by the National Science Foundation and organized by the National Weather Service, the University of Alaska, ARCUS, and the Eskimo Walrus Commission, with significant contributions from Alaska Native sea ice and walrus experts.
