

Working Together to Adapt to a Rapidly Changing North Alaska's Landscape Conservation Cooperatives



Addressing the challenges of a rapidly changing Arctic requires novel, holistic approaches that are grounded in the recognition that wildlife, habitats, waters, and people are all connected throughout large landscapes. However, most approaches are commonly constrained by political or jurisdictional boundaries, or focus on single species, habitats, or phenomena. As a new model for collaboration, Landscape Conservation Cooperatives are partnerships of diverse groups of experts, decision-makers, and communities that work across large landscapes in order to create boundary-breaking tools, resources, and solutions.
